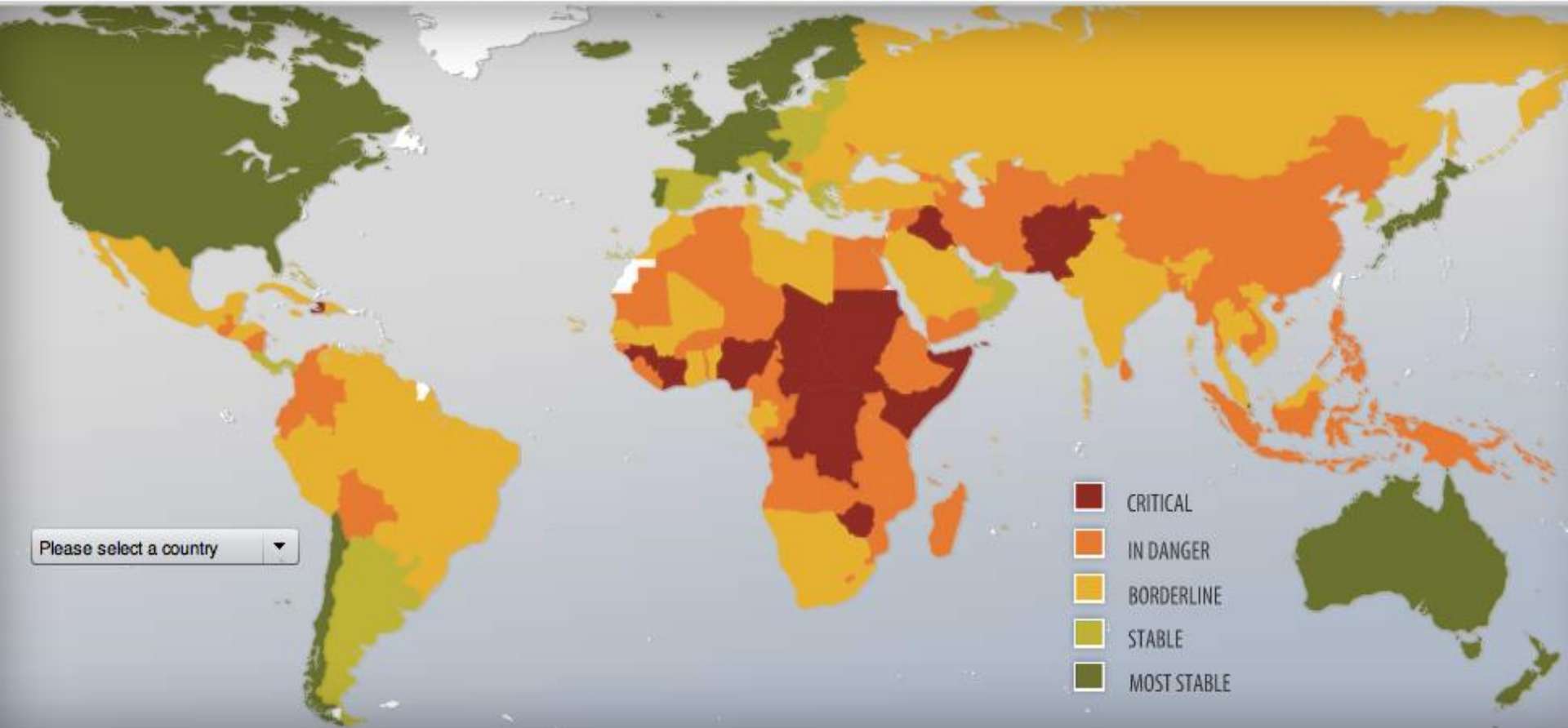

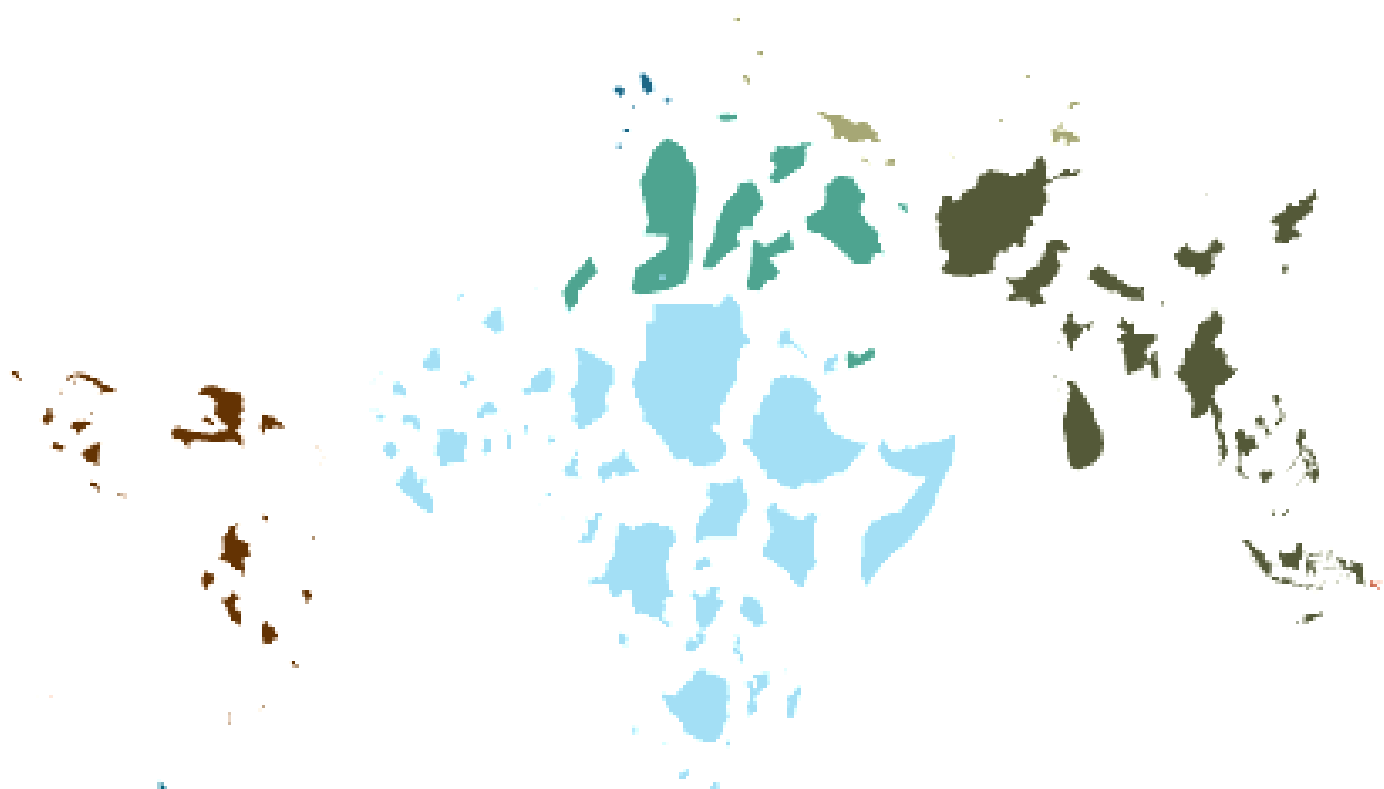

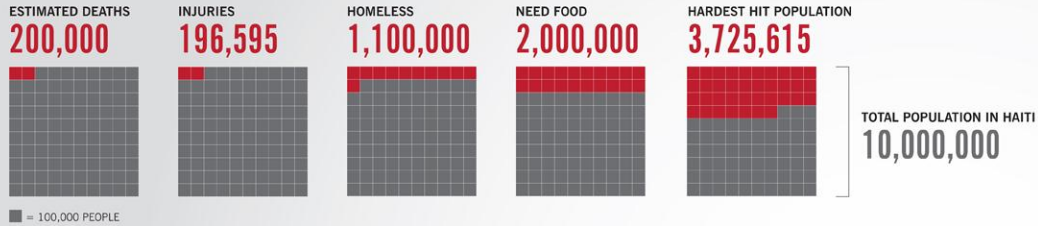

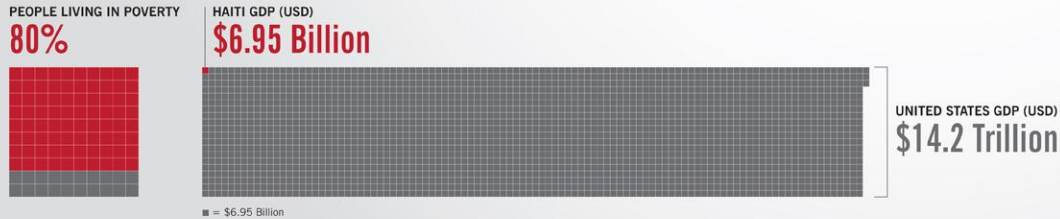
Thousands of Lives Devastated



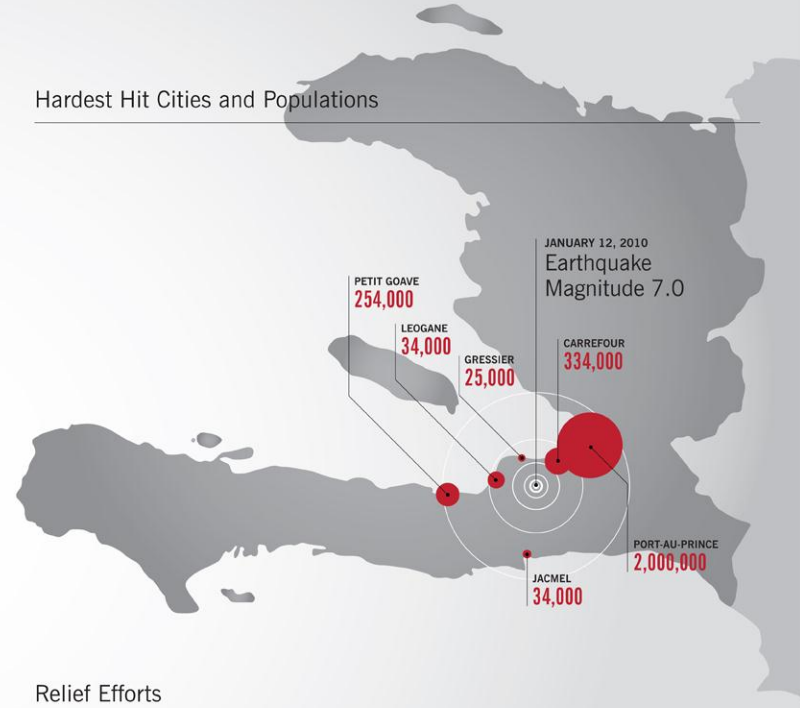
Estimated Age of the Hardest Hit Population



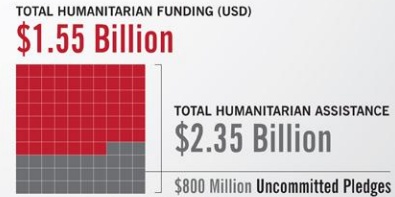
Already the Poorest Country in the Western Hemisphere

NOTE*
FUNDING = CONTRIBUTIONS + COMMITMENTS
Commitment: creation of a legal, contractual obligation between the donor and recipient entity, specifying the amount to be contributed.
Contribution: the actual payment of funds or transfer of in-kind goods from the donor to the recipient entity.
Pledge: a non-binding announcement of an intended contribution or allocation by the donor.
